Pro bono work is necessary to satisfy Rule 6.1 of the Model Rules of Professional Conduct, which strongly encourages lawyers to provide at least 50 hours of pro bono legal services to poor persons each year. Lawyers who retain pro bono cases earn CLE credit and a free voucher for a CLE course. Volunteers have access to mentoring and professional liability insurance is free. This is an excellent opportunity to get experience in a new field of law.

What We Do

Suffolk County has a significant volume of disabled and financially disadvantaged residents, including veterans. Access to the legal system is only one of the needs, and every practicing attorney can help. Preserving voluntary pro bono service is an essential goal of our profession. Suffolk County Lawyers continue to provide free legal services to residents with disabilities or financial difficulty. The Suffolk Pro Bono Project has helped increase the type and volume of services provided throughout recent years.

The Suffolk Pro Bono Project carefully screens each applicant to confirm that they meet federally established financial guidelines. The Project staff then reach out to a volunteer attorney to see if they are interested in the referral. The attorneys are never required to accept a referral and only decide whether to offer their services once they have met the client and reviewed the file. Help is especially needed in the following areas:

- Divorce and Child Support
- Bankruptcy
- Guardianships (Article 17A)
- Wills and Advanced Care Directives
- Name Changes
