MARCH ADVOCACY TIPS

A child support petition can be filed by either the person caring for the child, the Department of Social Services, or the child. Did you know that New York State's Office of Temporary and Disability Assistance (OTDA) has a Department of Child Support Services? The Child Support Program provides custodial parents with assistance in obtaining financial support and medical insurance coverage for their children by locating parents, establishing parentage, establishing or modifying support orders, and collecting and disbursing child support payments. Any parent, guardian, caretaker of a child, or child who needs support can enroll in child support services. Anyone who applies for public assistance (Family Assistance or Safety Net Assistance) may be referred for child support services without having to enroll. Medicaid applicants may also be referred for child support services to establish parentage and obtain medical support. To learn more, visit the child support services website.

New York's Language Access Policies

Under New York's language access law, all State agencies that interact with the public must provide interpretation services in any language with respect to the provision of agency services or benefits and must translate vital agency documents into the top 12 most commonly spoken non-English languages among limited English proficient (LEP) New Yorkers based on

Census data. In addition, State agencies also have the option to offer up to four additional languages beyond the required 12 based on factors such as regional language access needs, the number of recently arrived immigrants who have limited English proficiency, feedback from community groups, and the populations of individuals with limited English proficiency most commonly served by different agencies. If you have a court appearance, it is important to inform the court prior to the court date so they have enough time to arrange for an interpreter to be at the court date.

New York Immigrant Services Law


The New York Immigrant Services Law mandates important requirements for immigrant assistance service providers, or non-attorneys who offer limited immigration assistance to the public. Under this law, providers cannot (1) give legal advice or counsel a person on their eligibility for immigration status, including how to fill out answers on immigration forms, (2) state or hint that they can influence, or get special favors or specific outcomes from, the U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services, the Department of Homeland Security, the Executive Office for Immigration Review, or any other government entity, or (3) demand a fee for providing immigration forms or a referral to a qualified legal service provider. Providers must provide written contracts in the language understood by the immigrant customer and post clear, multi-lingual, signage about the limited scope of their services. Further, customers can cancel their contracts and get a refund and have their original documents and immigration file returned to then, even if there is a fee dispute. Anyone who believes they have been scammed or to report an entity that is not

LSLI's Consumer Debt Legal Assistance Project provides legal assistance to persons who are experiencing consumer debt problems, especially in matters of medical and credit card debt. Services may include litigation defense and representation, phone advice, and/or referral for further services, including bankruptcy where appropriate. Housing Insecurity Prevention Assistance Programs Open

Suffolk County Down Payment Assistance Program Open until April 1, 2025. The Suffolk County HOME Consortium down payment assistance funds are essentially zero-interest deferred loans that are forgiven after 10 years. The assistance provided will be up to \$30,000 for eligible applicants to assist with the down payment toward the purchase of an owner-occupied, single-family residence. Nassau County Down Payment Assistance Program Open Until June 18th, 2025. The Nassau County HOME Down Payment Assistance Program will provide eligible first-time homebuyers with up to \$50,000 towards down payment/closing costs towards the purchase of an eligible new or existing single-family home, provided that the applicant is income-eligible and meets all program requirements. 
Town of Babylon's Tenant-Based Rental Assistance Program opened on December 18th, 2023. This program is for extremely low-income households who are in rental arrears to help residents regain housing stability and prevent homelessness. For more information and to apply, please visit Long Island Housing Partnership's website.

Town of Babylon's Mortgage Arrears Program opened on February 27th, 2024. The Town of Brookhaven (Town) is making CDBG-CV funds available for low to moderate-income Town of Babylon residents with mortgage arrears incurred due to a COVID-19-related loss of income. Funds will cover a maximum of 6 consecutive months of arrears, subject to a cap of \$50,000, and are paid directly to the lender. Legal Services of Long Island, in partnership with Empire Justice Center, can now assist Nassau and Suffolk residential tenants with housing-related legal problems (like eviction) and a household income of up to 80% of the Area Median Income. Services are available through this partnership regardless of immigration status. Please call the office closest to you to see if you are eligible for legal services. Interpreters are available. Suffolk residents west of 112 can call 631-232-2400 and east of 112 can call 631-369-1112. Nassau residents can call 516-292-8100.




