Legal Services of Long Island continues to make major strides in providing free legal assistance to low-income families across Long Island. This work is especially meaningful this year as we celebrate our 60th anniversary. Over the past six decades, our organization has grown and transformed to become as accessible as possible to the communities we serve.

We meet people where they are: in libraries, courthouses, and throughout the community, and this progress would not be possible without the continued support of the Nassau and Suffolk County Bar Associations, legislators, and all those who continue to stand behind our mission.

We have also tremendously expanded our services, particularly within our Pro Bono Unit. This year, we hosted more clinics than ever before, assisting individuals with bankruptcy matters, Article 17-A guardianships, and advance directives. The program has evolved into a more hands-on model, allowing us to provide full legal representation when possible or directly assist clients with completing critical legal documents.

In addition, we have expanded our Community Legal Help Project in both counties. In Nassau County, we have been meeting with community members in libraries throughout the county and at the District Court. This important work would not be possible without the generous support of our partner law firms and the many dedicated individual volunteers who make it possible.

Our organization has also grown internally, with an expansion of staff, particularly within our Veterans' Rights Project. Thanks to the support of New York State and other partners, this growth has allowed us to reach more veterans and extend our services to even more communities in need.

As we reflect on 60 years of service, we extend our deepest gratitude to everyone who has supported Legal Services of Long Island along the way. As we enter our 60th year and look toward the future, we remain committed to continued growth and to ensuring that access to justice is a reality for all. HUMAN RIGHTS PROJECT SUCCESS STORIES

A Past Mistake, Not a Permanent Barrier: Legal Services of Long Island Protects Client's Livelihood - Client S came to Legal Services of Long Island with a problem that has become all too common across Long Island. After being hired for a position and completing several weeks of diligent, capable work, Client S was suddenly let go. The employer explained that New York State regulations required a work clearance review before employment could continue. As a result, Client S was left effectively unemployed because of a non-violent offense from more than a decade ago — a past mistake that resurfaced at a critical moment.

Determined to protect their livelihood, Client S turned to Legal Services of Long Island for help. **Staff Attorney Bob Scanlon** quickly stepped in, contacted the regulating agency directly, and requested reconsideration. After submitting additional supporting evidence, the agency approved the clearance — and Client S was back on the job in less than 24 hours. **Great work, Bob!** Your dedication and swift advocacy truly made the difference.

Cleared to Build a New Future: Legal Services of Long Island Helps Client Secure Insurance License - Client M came to LSLI looking for help with several Re-Entry issues. **Human Rights Project Staff Attorney Bob Scanlon** assisted Client M with the appeal of a decision by the New York State Department of Financial Services (DFS) to deny the client an insurance broker's license. LSLI was able to help the client with the process of gathering evidence of good character and rehabilitation, drafting personal statements and letters, and corresponding with DFS.

The licensing appeal was successful, and Client M is now gainfully employed as an insurance broker. This has led to a significant improvement in the client's livelihood and quality of life. **Congratulations, Bob, on a job well done!**

LSLI's Human Rights Project regularly helps clients in situations like these! Have you or someone you know received a letter from a regulating or licensing agency of New York State that says you have something on your background check that prevents you from working? We can help you determine if these bars to employment are mandatory or waivable.

The Human Rights Project provides legal assistance to low-income Nassau and Suffolk County residents through two distinct practice areas. The Re-entry practice area helps individuals overcome barriers created by a criminal record by assisting with certificates of relief from civil disabilities and certificates of good conduct, employment and housing discrimination, and denials of professional licenses. The Project also supports individuals released from prison within the last year with housing matters, including evictions, public benefits, and consumer debt issues. The second practice area serves low-income members of the LGBTQ+ community who are impacted by their transgender, non-conforming, or non-binary status, providing assistance with name changes, housing and employment discrimination, and public benefit denials. Advocacy Tip!

According to the **NYS Division of Human Rights**, if you experience workplace discrimination or harassment, you should first follow your employer's internal complaint process. Taking this step can strengthen your case if you later file a complaint with the Division, while skipping it may have a negative impact.

It's also important to keep detailed written records of any incidents and complaints you make. Verbal reports can be difficult to prove, so document what happened as soon as possible and store your records safely at home. Strong documentation can help protect your rights.

VETERANS RIGHTS PROJECT SUCCESS STORIES

Housing Security for Heroes Through Legal Services of Long Island's Advocacy - LSLI's Veterans Rights Project was instrumental in assisting two elderly veterans to avoid an eviction, move out of their private rental properties to subsidized housing, and help them maintain their quality of life.

The first veteran lived alone in a private rental apartment for thirty years, but his health began to worsen, and he was no longer able to maintain paying his rent on his Social Security retirement income. In 2025, his landlord brought a holdover action to remove him from his apartment. Several years ago, the veteran applied for Section 8 housing with a local housing authority, and it was discovered that when a voucher became available, the veteran was not contacted. The local housing authority was willing to correct the error and offer him the next available apartment in the housing authority. With this information, **Staff Attorney Susanna Laruccia** negotiated a stipulation to resolve the eviction proceeding, allowing the veteran time to move out of the apartment and move into subsidized housing that he could afford.

From Uncertainty to Stability: Legal Services of Long Island Helps Veterans Move into Subsidized Housing - A second veteran served in the Army during the late 1960s. He lived alone in his private rental apartment for over 25 years, but his landlord wanted to make renovations to the property and requested that he temporarily vacate the apartment. In addition, the veteran was struggling financially to maintain his expenses based on his limited retirement income. **Staff Attorney Susanna Laruccia** of the Veterans Rights Project tried to work out a way to allow the veteran to stay in his apartment or temporarily relocate while the renovations occurred, but was unsuccessful in having the parties reach an agreement. Ultimately, **Dolores Sclafani, Paralegal for the Veterans Rights Project**, was instrumental in helping the veteran apply for senior subsidized housing early enough in the process of the summary eviction proceeding that it gave him options when he needed to move out. **Attorney Laruccia** was able to negotiate a stipulation to allow the veteran to move out at the same time as a new senior subsidized housing apartment was becoming available. The veteran successfully moved into the subsidized housing apartment with the financial assistance of the landlord paying for his move.

Both veterans are now in affordable subsidized housing, which will allow them to maintain a more stable quality of life. **Congratulations, Susanna and Dolores, on a job well done!**

The Veterans Rights Project provides legal assistance to low-income United States military veterans. Legal services include assistance with various issues, including veterans' benefits and appeals, discharge upgrades, public benefits, landlord-tenant matters, consumer debt issues, select social security appeals, and family law matters. The family law matter assistance provided focuses on child support and excludes divorces, custody, and visitation. The Veterans Rights Project staff participate in community outreach such as tabling at VA Stand Downs and Job Assistance Fairs, and at Veterans' legal advice clinics. FORECLOSURE PREVENTION UNIT SUCCESS STORIES

A Timely Opportunity Saves Three Homes from Foreclosure - When three homeowners fell behind on their mortgages with no realistic path to reinstatement, modification, or repayment, and bankruptcy was not a viable option, the only apparent solution was to sell their homes. **LSLI Staff Attorney Carolyn Lander** of the Foreclosure Prevention Unit represented each of the clients as they faced the loss of their homes and searched for any alternative that could help them avoid foreclosure. Around that time, **Attorney Lander** learned that Sustainable Neighborhoods, a New York City-based nonprofit, had briefly reopened its Equitable Retention Mortgage Assistance Program, which offers 0% interest loans to senior citizens and individuals with disabilities to help reinstate mortgages.

Although the program was initially limited to New York City residents, **Attorney Lander** immediately contacted Sustainable Neighborhoods to advocate for her Nassau County clients. She soon learned the program would be expanding to Nassau residents for a short window. Acting quickly, **Attorney Lander** ensured her clients were prepared and first in line to apply before the program closed just weeks later. All three were approved, their mortgage arrears were paid, and three families were able to remain in their homes, turning what seemed like an inevitable foreclosure into renewed housing stability. **Congratulations, Carolyn,** on your outstanding work and dedication!

Quick Action Helps Veteran Avoid Foreclosure - A U.S. Veteran on Long Island was facing imminent foreclosure after a missed settlement conference led to a default judgment against him. The Veteran had been working with another agency, but due to an error by the foreclosing plaintiff, he never received notice of the conference and could not appear in court. With the case released from the settlement conference part, the previous agency could no longer assist and referred him to LSLI.

Staff Attorney Carolyn Lander reviewed the paperwork and discovered that the plaintiff had listed an incorrect address when requesting the court to schedule the settlement conference, meaning the Veteran was never notified of the settlement conference. With this crucial information, **Attorney Lander** secured the plaintiff's consent to vacate the default judgment. She then guided the Veteran through a mortgage modification, ultimately saving his home and helping him regain financial stability. **Great job, Carolyn!**

The Foreclosure Prevention Project provides free legal services to homeowners seeking to prevent foreclosure of their homes. Services include legal representation at court settlement conferences, drafting pleadings and motions, assistance with loan modifications and other loss mitigation options, and advice and counsel throughout the foreclosure process. As part of the HOPP network, a statewide coalition that includes HUD-certified housing counseling agencies, the Project collaborates with and refers clients to HOPP-funded nonprofit agencies when additional support is needed. Services are available to Long Island residents who live in homes facing foreclosure and meet low- to moderate-income guidelines set annually by HUD. Nassau residents can call (516) 292-8100. CONSUMER DEBT UNIT SUCCESS STORIES

LSLI Secures Justice for Client in Home Health Aide Dispute - Ms. I contacted Legal Services of Long Island after a private home health aide company sued her and her elderly mother. Ms. I had moved her 86-year-old mother—who was blind and hard of hearing—from South Carolina to Long Island to provide better support. The company agreed to continue services and bill Medicare, but after Ms. I complained about aides arriving late or missing visits, the company began billing them and accused them of stealing checks. Without the state-mandated 2-week notice, services were discontinued, and the company sued Ms. I, who did not personally guarantee her mother's debt, and her mother, whose only income was Social Security, which is protected from garnishment by judgment creditors.

Consumer Debt Attorney Maria DeGennaro reviewed Ms. I's records, amended her answer, and successfully moved to dismiss due to lack of jurisdiction (as she has not been served with court papers) and failure to state a claim (as she did not have a contract with the company). Given the company's repeated baseless claims, **DeGennaro** consulted attorney Ahmad Keshavarz and filed a Fair Debt Collection Practices Act lawsuit. After a full day of arbitration, the case settled for \$60,000, payable within 30 days to Ms. I. Ms. I expressed relief that the funds will help cover new medical challenges. **Congratulations to Maria DeGennaro, Ahmad Keshavarz, and the team for securing justice.**

A Fresh Start After a Difficult Debt Battle - After becoming disabled, Diana Velasquez struggled to manage basic expenses while still paying student loans from a for-profit school later exposed for fraud; when she could no longer afford the payments and was sued by a third-party debt buyer, she feared lasting damage to her credit and stability. The stress of knowing she had invested time and money into a program that provided no value made the situation even heavier, leaving her overwhelmed as she tried to cope with both medical challenges and financial uncertainty.

Remembering the help she once received from Legal Services of Long Island (LSLI) with medical insurance and a Special Needs Trust, she turned to the organization again. **Attorney Vivian Storm** reached out right away, assisting her in filing an Amended Answer and explaining each step clearly. **Attorney Maria DeGennaro** then took over, serving the debt buyer with Discovery and preparing a detailed hardship letter outlining Ms. Velasquez's disability, exempt income, and rights under the Fair Debt Collection Practices Act.

Following continued correspondence from LSLI, the debt buyer agreed to discontinue the lawsuit with prejudice, thereby precluding any future collection or refiling. This outcome provided the closure Ms. Velasquez desperately needed after years of stress linked to a degree that held no value and loans that should never have been pursued.

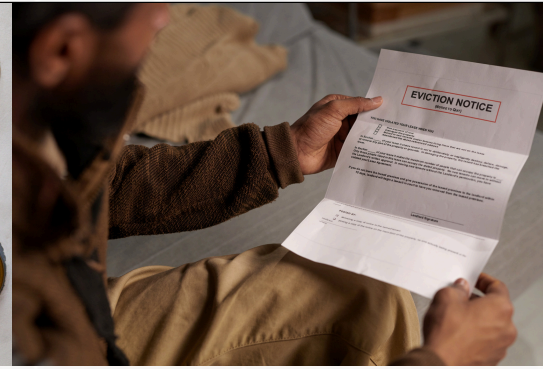
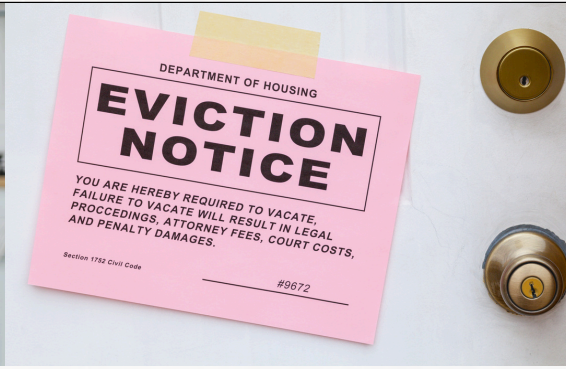
Ms. Velasquez shared that the resolution lifted "a world off of [her] shoulders," allowing her to focus fully on her health without the fear of ongoing debt collection. She expressed deep gratitude for the clarity, kindness, and effectiveness shown by **Supervising Attorney Vivian Storm** and **Attorney Maria DeGennaro**, calling the support "amazing" and essential for those without the resources to secure legal representation. **Congratulations to Attorneys Storm and DeGennaro on a truly outstanding job well done.**

SUFFOLK CIVIL UNIT SUCCESS STORIES

Protecting Stability Through Strong Advocacy - Legal Services of Long Island Staff Attorney **Jenny Park, Esq.**, helped a longtime Suffolk resident remain safely in their family home after an improper eviction attempt. The client had lived in the family home for many years when someone acting under a Power of Attorney for the owners filed an eviction proceeding trying to remove them, even though no rent had ever been asked for or paid, and the client was not a tenant under New York State Law. **Attorney Park** carefully reviewed the filings and quickly identified major problems with the case. She saw that the person bringing the eviction was not a landlord as defined by New York Law and did not have the legal standing to start a summary eviction proceeding, despite framing it as a landlord-tenant matter.

Attorney Park prepared a clear and effective motion explaining these issues, showing that the filing was improper and that the eviction could not legally continue. After reviewing her arguments, the Court dismissed the case, allowing the client to remain in their home without disruption. Thanks to **Attorney Park's** quick action, strong advocacy, and commitment to protecting vulnerable residents, what began as a stressful and confusing situation ended in stability and relief for the client. **Congratulations Jenny!**

Advocacy Tip!

With limited exceptions, a family member may not evict another family member in a summary proceeding (expedited legal process typically used in evictions); this is the case because where the occupancy of the subject premises arises out of the familial relationship a summary proceeding may not be maintained. If you have a client in these circumstances, please have the client call the main phone line to be screened for services or advocates can call the Legal Support Center for Advocates for further questions.

The Suffolk Civil Unit provides legal assistance to low-income residents with housing issues, including eviction proceedings, Section 8 termination hearings, and related appellate work. The unit also brings affirmative litigation on a limited basis to address violations of state or federal law. The Islandia office represents clients in Babylon, Smithtown, Brookhaven, Islip, and Huntington, while the Riverhead office serves Riverhead and all the East End towns. RESOURCES FOR YOUR CLIENTS



Free Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA)

(VITA) is available in Nassau and Suffolk counties for individuals with low-to-moderate incomes (generally under \$60,000-\$84,000), disabilities, or limited English proficiency. Services include free federal and state electronic filing, often with bilingual support. Key providers include the United Way of Long Island and Health & Welfare Council of Long Island (HWCLI).

How to Access VITA on Long Island:

- **Locate a Site:** Use the IRS VITA site locator tool to find the nearest location in Nassau or Suffolk.
- **Appointment Requirement:** Many sites require appointments.
- **Virtual Option:** HWCLI offers a virtual VITA program where documents are scanned, uploaded, and processed securely.

Services Provided:

- IRS-certified volunteers prepare basic tax returns and ensure taxpayers receive applicable credits like the Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC).
- What to Bring to a VITA Site
- To have taxes prepared, bring the following:
- Proof of identification (photo ID).
- Social Security cards for you, your spouse, and dependents.
- Birth dates for you, spouse, and dependents.
- Wage and earning statements (W-2, W-2G, 1099-R) from all employers.
- Interest and dividend statements from banks (Form 1099).
- Bank routing numbers and account numbers for direct deposit.
- Total paid for daycare provider and their tax ID number.

Important Update: New SNAP Work Rules – March 1, 2026

Legal Services of Long Island wants the community to know about new SNAP (food stamp) work rules starting March 1, 2026.

Who Is Affected?

These rules apply to **Able-Bodied Adults Without Dependents (ABAWD)**. You may be affected if you:

- Are 18–64 years old
- Do not live with a child under 14
- Are not pregnant
- Do not have a condition that prevents you from working

What Is Changing?

- ABAWD individuals who do not meet an exemption can only receive SNAP for 3 months in a 3-year period unless they meet work requirements.

How to Keep Your Benefits

You must do **one of the following**:

- Work and earn at least \$217.50 per week
- Participate in approved work or training programs (80 hours per month)
- Attend college and meet SNAP student rules
- Complete approved community service or work experience

Possible Exemptions

You may qualify for an exemption if you have a physical or mental health condition. A medical provider must complete a Medical Statement form.

Important

- Watch for mail from local Department of Social Services about work requirements or appointments.
- Missing requirements may cause SNAP benefits to stop after 3 months.

If you believe your benefits were wrongfully denied or terminated, please contact LSLI's Public Benefits Unit.

The Legal Support Center for Advocates (LSCA) has a unique role at LSLI as a legal backup center for advocates from social service agencies, religious organizations, health care facilities, and other community-based agencies. LSCA's Helpline provides phone support to community advocates so they may effectively assist their clients in welfare, housing, access to health care, disability issues, and other legal matters. This partnership with the community is especially valuable as it enables us to serve exponentially more clients than would be possible with our limited resources for direct legal services. When appropriate, LSCA facilitates internal referrals to one of LSLI's many programs. Advocates can reach us at (631) 232-2400.

Samantha Veronica Barros graduated from Liberty University School of Law in Virginia in May of 2021. She was the first one in her family to graduate from law school. In her 3rd year of law school, she began to work at Virginia Legal Aid Society where she assisted impoverished clients in matters pertaining to guardianships, unemployment benefits and evictions. She also advised clients during the COVID pandemic by explaining the ever-changing temporary rules set forth in the eviction moratorium.

In September 2021, Samantha was admitted to the North Carolina Bar. Her very high Uniform Bar Examination score paved the way for her to transfer and be admitted in any jurisdiction, including New York.

In October 2021, she began to work for Legal Services of Long Island in the Civil Unit as a Law Graduate. She was admitted to the New York State Bar in November 2022 and continues her work now as a Staff Attorney in the same unit. Samantha is in court representing tenants at least 2 days a week, handling anywhere from 10 to 20 evictions for individuals and families, thereby helping them maintain their housing. She finds it very rewarding to assist the Hispanic community by helping them understand the eviction process. It has been her goal as an attorney to help those in need and advocate for children who may otherwise become homeless without her help. Samantha's supervisor says, "Samantha is an exceptional attorney with a great soul."

Her desire to serve her community extends beyond the workplace. Samantha serves as a teacher 3 days a week in her church's children's ministry. On Sundays, she teaches pre-k children, and on Fridays, she teaches third to fifth-grade girls. She also assists on Wednesday nights at her church with the Explorer Kids, focusing on pre-teen social and morale development activities, as well as Bible teaching. Samantha says, "I have two callings God has shown me: serving children and being an attorney. Both are equally important."

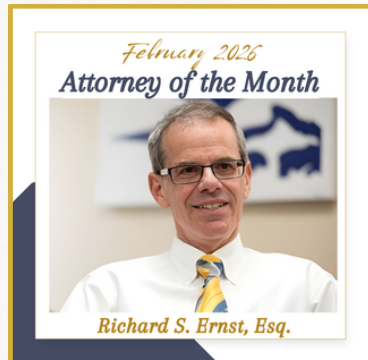

Guiding a Family Through Guardianship

The clients sought legal assistance to be appointed Guardians of the Person of their 22-year-old son, who has lived with intellectual and developmental disabilities since infancy. In New York, this requires an Article 17-A Guardianship proceeding in Surrogate's Court. Working closely with the family, the volunteer attorney and her firm guided them through the process to ensure it was as smooth and seamless as possible. The Court ultimately appointed the parents as guardians, allowing them to continue providing the care and support their son has relied on throughout his life.
